

Connecticut Results First Policy Oversight Committee
Tuesday, November 12, 2013 Meeting

- I. Rep. Walker called the meeting to order. New committee members introduced themselves.
- II. Andrew Clark, executive director of the Institute for Municipal and Regional Policy, described Results First Initiative collaboration efforts with other states and gave an overview of the work done in Connecticut.
- III. Sara Dube, project manager of the Pew MacArthur Results First national initiative discussed the Results First approach and model. Steve Lize, Pew’s technical consultant, and members of the working group presented “Connecticut Results First Model Summary,” a PowerPoint detailing the project progress in Connecticut.

The presentation included a detailed accounting of Results First model work in Connecticut to date showing criminal justice system cost estimates; the determination of marginal costs in both the adult and juvenile justice system; recidivism analysis; evidence-based programs, their cost/benefit analysis and effects on recidivism; and a description of the model’s *Consumer Reports*-style index.

- IV. Rep. Walker explained that the following subcommittees of the Oversight Committee would be formed:
 1. Adult Criminal Justice to review that component of the Results First model and develop recommendations for the full committee
 2. Juvenile Justice to review that component of the model and develop recommendations for the full committee
 3. Process to act as a steering committee for the full committee, assist in ensuring the Connecticut work aligns with other statewide performance-based policy initiatives, and provide recommendations to the full committee on other policy areas for inclusion in the Results First model.
